## A Word From Our Pastor.....

This is my prayer: May the Lord, our God, bless each of us and our country with a greater move toward freedom in Christ by allowing the Spirit of the Lord to reign in our hearts and in our nation once more. #### From the Music Stand.....

You are as aware as I am of the great debate that exists in our churches today concerning hymns versus Praise & Worship songs. There are those who state that the old hymns that are scripture based are the best; while others worship more fully with the more contemporary praise songs. I certainly will not claim to worship better with one over the other, but what I will say is that depending on the situation, certain songs come to mind quicker than others.

In doing some research, I will restate here some information that I found:

A crucial word that many folks miss when reading Ephesians 5:19 which deals with singing being evidence of a Christian life that is Spirit-filled: "SPEAKING to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord." Ok, so why is this important, the use of the word "speaking" at the beginning of this verse? Simply because the most important part of any song or hymn or anything spiritual are the WORDS! Truth and doctrine and principles for living are conveyed using words; the music which accompanies it is secondary to this. Of course, the music should fit the message and it is sometimes the hook that catches the ear of the listener, but let's remember, the message is what is important. Hence, the lyrics should be scripture based, with depth and meaning... the message is more important than the medium in which it is presented.

Each of us worships differently. We are not mass-produced cookie-cutters and our ways of worship are just as different. Worship songs are just that, WORSHIP SONGS! In attempting to bridge the gap, keep in mind this purpose. There will be days when one song touches your soul more than another. Just keep on singing, but can I add that while the Lord hears our every thought, He does like to hear you praise and worship OUT LOUD so others can join in.
